WHAT IS RADIO BROADCASTING?

Some states offer this event at Tournaments. When offered, it is typically a Limited Preparation Event that follows some of the same general guidelines. Check with the Speech Association in your state for specific state guidelines.

- 1. Limited Preparation Time (usually between 30 and 45 minutes) for each round
- 2. Presentation time: Varies from state to state, but is typically ~5 minutes.
- 3. A student may have personal preparation materials such as a stopwatch, dictionary, thesaurus, pronunciation guide, blank paper, highlighters, pen and/or pencil, scissors, and tape or glue during the preparation period.
- 4. Each student is given a folder of News articles (newspaper, television or internet-based) prepared by the tournament host and are tasked with preparing an original news Radio Broadcast by compiling information from those stories.
- 5. Students must use the news script provided by the contest, and may not add material, except transition sentences, introductions (such as call letters) and conclusions.
- 6. In some states this material will include a prepared commercial advertising a product or service that must be used in the speakers' script. In others, students must create a commercial given a designated product or service during the preparation time.
- 7. The newscast should reflect the student's ability to select newsworthy items from the copy provided. Structure of the news presentation should reflect thoughtful planning which incorporates a smooth flow from one item to another.
- 8. **BASIS FOR JUDGING:** Vocal variety utilizing a conversational style marked by clear articulation and correct pronunciation. Smooth transitions.

NOTE:

- In some states (example Indiana) the packet of News articles for preliminary rounds is provided to each school during the week leading up to the tournament.
- Students must come prepared to compete and no "Prep-Time" is given at the tournament. The process to prepare for competition remains the same, there is simply no preparation time limits for preliminary rounds.
- Semi-Finals and Finals are run as "Limited Prep" the day of the tournament.
